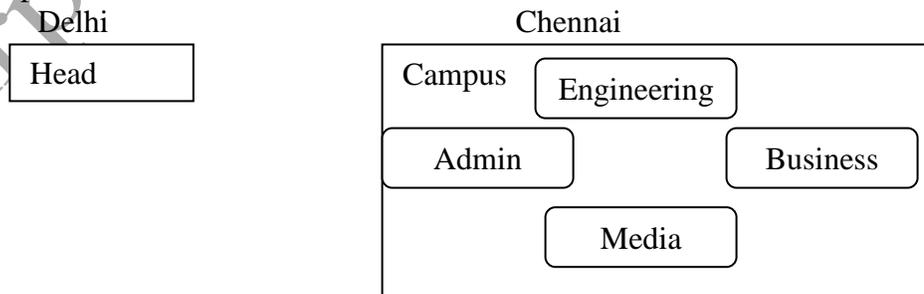
d) Reduce the following Boolean Expression to its simplest form using K-map: (3)

- PIONEER Edu Services Ltd. is an educational organization. It is planning to setup its India campus at Chennai with its head office at Delhi. The Chennai campus has 4 main buildings – ADMIN, ENGINEERING, BUSINESS and MEDIA.

You as a network expert have to suggest the best network related solutions for their problems raised in (i) to (iv), keeping in mind the distances between the buildings and other given parameters.



Shortest distances between various buildings:

ADMIN to ENGINEERING	55 m
ADMIN to BUSINESS	90 m
ADMIN to MEDIA	50 m
ENGINEERING to BUSINESS	55 m
ENGINEERING to MEDIA	50 m
BUSINESS to MEDIA	45 m
DELHI Head Office to CHENNAI Campus	2175 km

Numbers of Computers installed at various buildings are as follows:

ADMIN	110
ENGINEERING	75
BUSINESS	40
MEDIA	12
DELHI Head Office	20
